

## Registration Information

- Registration is on a first-come, first served basis.
- Class schedules are available at Great Neck House, 14 Arrandale Ave and at the Steppingstone Marina. Call Great Neck House at 482-0355 for a schedule to be mailed.
- Park cards are required for resident rate registration and need to have an expiration date past the end of the class.
- Non Park District residents are permitted if space permits at an additional fee.
- No refunds unless notification is received 10 business days before the class date.
- There will be a \$20 processing fee on all refunds. Unless class is cancelled due to lack of enrollment.

## Junior Courses (Ages 7ô 17)

For junior courses, children's boats are grouped according to age and ability. Classes use Rhodes 19, Optimist, puffers, lasers, row boats, canoes, kayaks and motorboats.

### Basic Sail

1/2 dayô 1 week min enrollment

Introduction to sailing. Participants will learn about basic sailing skills like parts of a boat and points of sail. These classes, weather pending, will end on a Friday with a class regatta. Minimum enrollment required.

### Sail Camp

Full dayô 1 week min enrollment

Introduction to sailing and boating. Participants will be immersed in a curriculum of sailing that will cover parts of a boat, points of sail, mariner skills (knot tying, craftsmanship and boating terms) and team building. The class will culminate, weather pending, with a class regatta on Friday. Minimum Enrollment required.

### Nautical Camp

1/2 dayô 4 week min enrollment

A more advanced opportunity for participants to immerse themselves into the nautical environment. Participants will engage in sailing, covering attainable aspects of the sport in the time given. The participants will also engage in kayaking and canoeing when the weather is not suitable for sailing. Participants will practice for a regatta that will take place sometime during the final week of the four week camp, weather pending. Minimum Enrollment required.

## Maritime Stewardship Camp

Full day—4 week min enrollment

An excellent opportunity for participants to immerse themselves in a full circle curriculum. The participants will be engaged in all aspects of the waterfront activities. Participants will practice sail racing that will culminate in a Junior Sailing Association sponsored regatta at a nearby sailing club. This camp is a real solid opportunity for participants that have a real interest in maritime activities to become advanced sailing and kayaking sportsmen. Minimum Enrollment required.

## Foul Weather (Adult and Child)

When weather conditions prevent on-the-water sessions, appropriate indoor activities are provided. There will be no refunds or rescheduling for foul weather.

## Adult Courses

Due to the small class size the instructor will give each student instructions based on their level. Minimum Enrollment required.

### Basic Sail

Introduction to sailing. Participants will learn about basic sailing skills like parts of a boat and points of sail. (12 hours)

### Introductory Sail

Hoist the sails and you're on your way (with one of our instructors of course) This program is designed to see if you want to learn to take the helm of a sailboat. Come experience a sail aboard one of our Rhodes 19. This program is designed to find out weather sailing is for you. (3 hours)

## Family Courses

### Family Course

These classes are for parents/guardians who want to take the course together with their children. The course is available upon request. Minimum Enrollment required.



A simple swim test is required for enrollment in any of the sailing programs.
